



Sports & Social Club VE Day Quiz



30. Match these photos to the names:



Lyudmila Pavlichenko – Soviet sniper with 309 confirmed kills, one of the top military snipers of all time. Awarded Gold Star and Hero of the Soviet Union.

Nancy Wake – resistance fighter and member of Britains Special Operations Executive. Operating in occupied France, leading 7,000 guerilla troops. Considered the most wanted women in France due to her effective sabotage work.

Jacqueline Cochran – Proposed all womens flight division for USAF before war broke out. Going on to break numerous flying records and training many US Air Force pilots throughout the war. She was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal in 1945.

Virginia Hall – ‘the woman with the limp’, wearing a prosthetic leg due to an early hunting accident, she was the first femail operative for the Special Operations Executive. Working in occupied France reporting on German troop movements. Awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, the only civilian woman to earn one.

Ruby Bradley – US Army nurse captured 3 weeks after Pearl Harbour, held as a POW for 37 months, performing over 230 surgeries, assisting in childbirths, smuggling food and medical supplies. After WW2 she went on to serve as a nurse in the Korean War. Reaching the rank of Colonel before retiring in 1963.

Susan Travers – When surrounded by German troops in Libya she drove the lead truck that led 2,500 Free French soldiers to safety under heavy fire. Her truck being hit 11 times. She went on to drive a self-propelled anti-tank gun in France and became an official member of the French Foreign Legion – by omitting her gender from her application.

	<p>Hedy Lamarr – Austrian immigrant to the US who became a Hollywood Starlet. But she was also involved in the creation of a radio guidance system for allied torpedoes. Working out a method to prevent the jamming of radio waves. Technology that eventually led to wifi and bluetooth.</p> <p>Noor Inayat Khan – descendant of Indian royalty she trained as a nurse with the Red Cross. Going on to join the Women’s Auxiliary Air Force after escaping to England. She was recruited to the Special Operations Executive she went into occupied France, working in the resistance until her capture in 1943. Eventually sent to Dachau after refusing to talk under interrogation, finally executed still refusing to talk.</p>
